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Please note that the following substantial ISSP questions are always asked together with a set of background questions collecting mainly demographic information. Since countries are allowed to ask these questions country-specifically and then harmonise the data to reach the pre-defined measurement goal, there is no universal background questionnaire. A questionnaire version some countries use is available on the GESIS ISSP webpages at: https://www.gesis.org/en/issp/data-and-documentation/issp-background-variables.

It is accompanied by a document called the ISSP "BV Guidelines," which provides detailed information on the measurement goals and coding instructions. Corresponding guidelines for the ISSP questionnaire at hand: ISSP Demographic Methods Group (2024). ISSP Background Variables Guidelines for ISSP 2025. Cologne: GESIS.

Notes to ISSP members:

- 1. All notes which are not part of the questionnaire and intended only for members are enclosed in pointed, angle brackets.
- 2. All the elements in questions which require local adaptation are enclosed in square brackets.
- 3. TN = translation note; Notes on question wording should help the understanding and the translation of the question; thus, a translation of the note itself is not intended.
- 4. Item history and topics (in blue font colour) are reported above question text
 - The 'N's and the 2015/2005/1997/1989 question numbers for the repeat questions are just meant to alert members to the fact that certain questions/ items have already been asked in earlier modules. You should not retain this information in your questionnaire.
 - ISSP policy on questions which you have already translated for an earlier module is that members should not tinker with wording to make slight improvements. Only real mistakes in translation should be changed. These should be clearly documented in your technical report.
- 5. All the substantive questions must be asked and asked in the order presented here. If, for any reason, you have to change the question order, this should be clearly documented in your technical report.
- 6. The module-specific background variable (Contract type) is also obligatory and should be handled as ISSP background variable with regard to question wording. However, there is a recommendation that the ISSP 2025 drafting group politely asks to follow with regard to question order.
- 7. Part 1 of the questionnaire should be asked to all respondents (Q1-Q7);
 - Part 2 of the questionnaire should be asked to respondents working for pay (Q8-Q33);
 - Part 3 of the questionnaire should be asked to respondents not working for pay (Q34-Q48); Additional compulsory BV;
 - If you decide in favour of the optional items (O1-O7), then they should be asked to all respondents.

If possible, please ask only once whether the respondent is working for pay. (The question is also part of the BV).
