

Call for Papers: The ISSP "Health and Healthcare II" module International Journal of Sociology 2026/2 or 3

The *International Journal of Sociology (IJS)* publishes research on issues central to cross-national and comparative scholarship in sociology. It has a long tradition of publishing thematic issues on topics of interest to a wide audience. Published works are theoretically refined and empirically complex, and embody a global perspective essential for sociological scholarship. On August 30th, 2024, GESIS released the latest dataset of the ISSP 2021 Health and Health Care II module (<u>https://www.gesis.org/en/issp/data-and-documentation/health-and-health-care/2021</u>). On this occasion, the conveners of the ISSP Drafting Group and the Editor-in-chief of IJS solicit contributions to a special issue on this new data. The special issue will include an introduction to the module's history and development and descriptive findings based on that survey. The remainder of the journal is open to substantive contributions that use the "Health and Health Care II" data showcasing analyses using this data. Contributions are not limited to the new data but can use any of the existing health modules.
